

2016 BUDGET PROCESS

Preparation of the City's 2016 Operating Budget is well underway. The process, which is expected to be completed sometime in December with City Council adoption of the budget or revenue and spending plan, has been unfolding for several months and includes the following major milestones:

 During the summer, the City Council reviewed various projects for future construction. The list of projects is a plan, not only for 2016, but for the subsequent five years. The Six-Year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) is updated each year as projects are completed, added or deleted,

- depending on funding sources and needs. With the annual adoption of the CIP, the stage is set for some of the major purchases for the upcoming budget year.
- Throughout the summer, the various
 City departments are at work
 projecting budget needs for 2016.
 The City Manager holds meetings
 with individual department/
 division managers to review needs,
 justifications and resources. The City
 Manager is charged with assembling
 the preliminary budget so that a
 balanced plan can be considered by
 the City Council.

The Pasco City Council meets every Monday at 7pm (except for 5th Mondays) at City Hall, 525 N. 3rd Ave. Watch the Council meetings LIVE on PSC-TV Channel 191 on Charter Cable, or on the web at www.pasco-wa.gov/video.



- The Council next receives the preliminary budget and budget message from the City Manager. By law, the preliminary budget must be filed with the Council at least 60-days before the end of the fiscal year. Copies of this preliminary budget must also be made available to the public at least six weeks before January 1. Once prepared, copies of the preliminary budget will be available by contacting the Finance Department or on the City's website at: www.pasco-wa.gov/budget.
- The City's general fund, which is the largest (accounting for approximately 30% of all City expenditures) and provides services such as police, fire, parks, municipal court and other general government operations, is funded primarily by City taxes on property, retail sales and utilities. The City Council must hold a public hearing on revenue sources for the 2016 budget and consider any changes to the property tax levy. The property tax levy for 2016 must be set by the City Council no later than November 30.
- On or before the first Monday in December, the Council must hold a final public hearing on the 2016 Operating and Capital budgets. Only after providing for public input, can the Council adopt the final budget. By law the City Council must adopt a budget prior to the beginning of the year.

Change Your Clock - Change Your Batteries

As daylight savings time ends on November 1, the Fire Department wants to remind us to make another change that could save our lives – changing batteries in smoke alarms.

The most commonly cited causes of non-working smoke alarms are worn or missing batteries. Working smoke alarms nearly cut in half the risk of dying in a home fire.
