# **2017 BUDGET PROCESS**

Each year the City Council must adopt a budget prior to the beginning of its fiscal year, which begins January 1. The process of development by staff, recommendations by the City Manager and final approval by the Council begins in mid- to late-summer. Working within estimates prepared by the Finance Department and guidelines outlined by the City Manager, the various City departments outline operational spending priorities and needs, as well as one-time or capital-spending proposals.

The timetable and process within which the budget must be prepared and approved are outlined in state law. The Finance Department requests, on or before the second Monday in September, City departments to prepare detailed estimates of revenues and expenditures for the 2017 year. This information must be filed with finance on or before the fourth Monday in September. These estimates are then presented to the City Manager "before the first business day in October." The City Manager must distribute to the City Council the proposed preliminary budget showing expenditures by each department and sources of revenues for financial operations "by the first Monday in October."

At least 60 days before the end of the year (October 28) the City Manager is required to file the preliminary budget and budget message with the City Clerk and City Council. Copies of the document must then be made available to the public by no later than six weeks prior to the beginning of the new budget year (November 10).



While staff and Council note public input at various forums throughout the year, the formal budget process provides additional public opportunities to review and comment on the budget:

- The Council must hold a public hearing on revenue sources for the 2017 budget, including any possible changes to property tax revenues prior to the Council vote on the annual property tax levy which must be done before November 30 (this is currently set for October 24).
- The Council must also hold a public hearing on the proposed 2017 Operating and Capital Projects Budgets before adoption (currently scheduled for November 21).

• The City Council is scheduled to consider adoption of the 2017 budget at its meeting of December 5.

## Councilmember Mike Garrison, 1943-2016

The City of Pasco mourns the death of longtime Councilmember and former Mayor Mike Garrison who passed away July 27 after a battle with leukemia. Councilmember Garrison was first elected to the Pasco City Council in 1987 and served as Mayor for six of the over 28 years of his service to the Pasco community. During Councilmember Garrison's tenure, Pasco grew from nearly 20,000 to 70,000 in population while reducing the crime rate more than 80%.

His "no nonsense" approach to issues was appreciated by both Council and staff.

The City Council is in the process of selecting a replacement to serve the remainder of the term, to expire at the end of 2017. The Council hopes to have a replacement named by the end of October.
