

City Council Creates Inclusivity Commission

On February 20, the Pasco City Council approved a resolution reinforcing the City's commitment to being an "Inclusive City" and creating a citizen Inclusivity Commission. The Resolution declares the City as "...committed to embracing diversity and promoting equality among our workforce, residents, businesses and visitors..." The Resolution further provides for a seven member, ad-hoc commission to assist the Council in its efforts to promote inclusivity in Pasco. The Commission is charged to "conduct activities... identify means... and make such recommendations to the City Council for action, education and guidance to foster an environment that includes, accepts, respects and appreciates all members of our community."

The members of the Inclusivity Commission will be appointed by Mayor Matt Watkins with confirmation by the City Council. The Commission is to have an ad-hoc term of 24 months which can be extended by vote of the Council. Commission members must be residents who have lived within the Pasco City limits for at least one year, or who currently own a licensed business operating within the City. Residents interested in serving on the Commission, which is scheduled to meet monthly at a time/day to be determined, are invited to submit an application by May 4, which can be found online at the City's website, www.pasco-wa.gov.

Councilmembers Pete Serrano, Blanche Barajas and Ruben Alvarado were appointed to a committee of the City Council to draft the Resolution ultimately adopted by the Council.

"I think this gives validity to every voice in Pasco," said Councilmember Blanche Barajas at the February 20 meeting. "It empowers people to now step forward and feel they're part of a community."

Finalist for "All-America City"

The City of Pasco has been named one of 20 finalists for the prestigious national "All-America City" Award (AAC) given by the National Civic League.

The award, given to 10 communities each year, celebrates and recognizes neighborhoods, villages, towns, cities, counties, tribes and regions that engage residents in innovative, inclusive and effective efforts to tackle critical challenges. The 2018 award theme is "Promoting Equity Through Inclusive Civic Engagement" and the communities involved are nationally recognized for their inclusive engagement processes, projects and community vision.

The AAC application involved a description of three community projects with a clear community-wide commitment to inclusiveness, equity, impact, innovation, civic engagement and cross-sector collaboration. The City, for its three projects, chose "Police-Community Relations", "Better Representation through City Council District-Based Elections", and "Somos Pasco (We Are



Pasco)" to highlight the community's civic engagement.

The 20 finalist communities will compete June 22-24 to be recognized as one of ten All-America Cities for 2018. Each community will bring a team to participate in presentations and workshops for three days in Denver, Colorado.
