IMPORTANT: Read all Rules and Initial All Areas Indicated

- Registration application must be received by 5:00 pm on Thursday June 30, 2022. Registrations received after this date may not be eligible for the parade.
- 2. There will be no registration the day of the parade.
- 3. Due to limited space we can not accept any additional vehicles or horses to already registered participants the day of the parade.
- Check-In is between 7:00-9:30 am. Check in will end at 9:30 am. NO late participants will be accepted.
- 5. Please arrive early to avoid any confusion or delay of your entry.
- 6. Equestrian entries check in at 2nd Avenue & Nixon, please access Nixon via 1st Avenue. All other entries check in at 4th & Court Street.
- 7. Parade theme is Red, White, and Blue.
- 8. Judging will take place at 8:30 am for all entries except drill teams. Drill teams will be judged from 9-9:30 am.
- 9. Refreshments will be available in Volunteer Park beginning at 7:30 am.

ATTENTION EQUESTRIAN UNITS:

- 1. There must be a "hold harmless" statement, duly signed for each rider participating in an equestrian unit. If the rider is under 18 years of age, a parent or legal guardian must sign.
- 2. All riders must have some type of personal insurance (Homeowners, Farm Liability, Equine Liability etc.) in effect which will cover their parade activities.
- It is the obligation of the person signing the parade application for the equestrian unit to ascertain that all participants have some type of appropriate insurance. Units having a blanket policy which covers their organization, and all riders in their unit, do not need individual insurance policies.
- All Animals must be under the control of their owner/handler at all times.
- ALL EQUESTRIAN UNITS ARE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE A POOPER SCOOPER.

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ATTENTION FLOAT & MOTORIZED VEHICLE UNITS:

- 1. If you are driving a motorized vehicle in the parade, you must hold a current and valid driver's license.
- You are required to have current automobile liability insurance covering bodily injury and property damage in amounts no less than what
 is legally required in the State of Washington. Automobile Liability, Business Automobile Liability or Fleet Liability will satisfy this requirement
- 3. All individuals driving a motorized vehicle in the parade will be required to sign a Release of Liability waiver confirming they are a licensed driver and that they carry the State of Washington's minimum amount of automobile liability coverage for the vehicle(s) they will be driving. If your group has a Business Auto or Fleet Liability policy that covers your group to drive in the parade, the authorized representative from your group should sign the Release of Liability waiver.
- 4. CANDY AND ÓTHER ITEMS ARE NOT TO BE THROWN FROM ANY MOVING VEHICLE! Any item being distributed to spectators must be done by walkers escorting the parade entry or float. The parade entry signatory/signee is solely responsible for the actions of all those who participate under its entry and those who choose not to follow these rules. Not following these rules can lead to injury or death of spectators, especially children. If your group does distribute candy or other items to the spectators, please provide walkers on both sides of your float or vehicle to do so. All items must be tossed into the crowd, at their feet, away from the parade procession and away from vehicles. Do not throw candy and other items into the middle of the street.
- Motorized vehicles, trucks and cars: NO EXCESSIVE SPEEDS, BURN-OUTS, TRICK TWO-WHEEL DRIVING, or DANGEROUS MA-NEUVERS.
- 6. The vehicle driver must be in control of their vehicle at all times.

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General Entry Rules

- 1. All vehicles entered into the parade, or pulling floats must be in good working condition.
- Please note that measurements and spacing of the floats and vehicle entrants are done the evening before, based on the truck/trailer
 measurements you entered in your original application. Only vehicles registered prior to the parade will be allowed into the staging area.
 NO ADDITIONAL VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE DAY OF THE PARADE!
- 3. VIP's are encouraged to be on a decorated float or vehicle. It is the responsibility of all VIP's to obtain their own vehicle with the exception of City, County and other government officials. Government officials, we will do our best to acquire convertible vehicles for your use.
- The American Flag has very specific rules for display. Please visit the following link to make sure you show proper respect for the flag

- 5. If your float or parade entry has a sound system, speakers, band, noisy generator or other load noise that was not indicated on your parade application, you may be asked to cease the noise. We do not want to place your entry next to another entry that will also have loud noise or next to entries with animals.
- 6. Please help us keep our streets and parks clean by throwing your trash in the proper receptacles.

Political Entries (Representatives: State, Local and Federal)

1. Any entries that are either for "Election" or "Re-Election" are considered political and will be staged out of the VIP, City Council and Representative area. If you are asking us to place you in the VIP lineup and you or your group choose to place signs that indicate elect or reelect you will be moved further back in the lineup. Please consider two entries, one as a Representative and one as an Elect or Re-Elect.

General Parade Information:

- The parade begins at 10 am.
- Parade entrants must maintain a distance of no more than 50 feet from the entrant in front of you.
- Once the parade begins, be prepared to move as soon as your turn comes. If an entry holds up the parade flow for any reason, you may be asked to leave the parade route at the first, and safest opportunity.
- The parade route begins on at the corner of 4th Avenue and Sylvester Street. From there, you will proceed west on Sylvester Street to 14th Avenue. You will then take a left (south) on 14th Avenue and go to Clark Street where you will take another left (east). The parade will end at 12th Avenue and Clark Street near the Booth Building.
- If you have an emergency and need to exit the parade route, please pull as far right as possible to allow those behind you to continue, then exit the route at the next and safest cross street.
- If you have a medical emergency during the parade, please dial 911 then pull as far to the right as possible to allow those behind you to continue.

Safety Rules

- 1. Candy and or giveaways **SHALL NOT** be thrown from any moving vehicles. Any entrant with a moving vehicle who wishes to distribute candy and/or other items to the parade spectators must have walkers on both side of the vehicle to dispense the items.
- 2. Riders are not to jump on and off of your entry during the parade.
- 3. The spraying of water by any means such as: the throwing of water balloons, use of super soakers, or water guns will not be allowed.
- 4. The dragging of any item from an entry will not be allowed.
- 5. All floats must have a fire extinguisher on board. All other entries are encouraged to have a fire extinguisher on hand.
- 6. No alcohol or other illicit substances are allowed in the parade.
- 7. No Firearms, fireworks, or flames are allowed by any participant.
- 8. Only vehicles entered into the parade will be allowed into the staging area. Additional materials must be carried in by hand.
- 9. All vehicles MUST be in good working order, adequately insured, and driven by a licensed driver.
- 10. In the event of an emergency, all entries will move as far right as possible and stop to allow emergency vehicles to pass.
- 11. The parade route is approximately 1.8 miles long. Please have plenty of water on hand for your group.
- 12. Any person walking with your entry must be capable of walking the full length of the parade route without difficulty.
- 13. Children must be under adult supervision at all times.
- 14. Exhaust systems must extend beyond any and all decorations as to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning.
- 15. Compressed gases (such as helium) and generators must be secured.
- 16. Motorized vehicles, trucks, and cars: NO EXESSIVE SPEEDS, BURN-OUTS, TRICK TWO-WHEEL DRIVING, OR DANGEROUS MANEUVERS.
- 17. DO NOT STOP YOUR FORWARD PROGRESS.
- 18. Fire or open flame on any entry is prohibited.
- 19. Smoking is prohibited on any parade float or entry.
- 20. Use of, possession of, or being under the influence of alcohol beverages or illicit substances is prohibited.
- 21. Drivers must have 180° forward vision. Be vigilant and watch out for children darting into the streets.
- 22. All participants/vehicles must maintain a forward motion with no more than 50 feet between each entry.
- 23. Commercial or large vehicles should provide spotters, one on either side of the vehicle.
- 24. Respect other entries! If you are the victim of disrespectful acts or assault in any form please flag down a police officer, parade staff or parade volunteer. If you are found in violation of this rule you will be immediately withdrawn from the parade.
- 25. The City of Pasco reserves the right to bar from the parade at any time any entrant is not conforming to the rules and guidelines or refusing to follow instructions of police or parade officials.

Release Of Liability, Assumption Of Risk, And Indemnity Agreement

I, the undersigned applicant am eighteen years of age or older and desire entry into the **Grand Old 4th of July Parade, July 4, 2022,** and am fully aware of the fact there are special dangers and risks inherent in this activity, including, but not limited to, the risk of serious physical injury, death or other harmful consequences that may arise or result directly or indirectly to the company, group or organization I am associated with in this event or as a private individual entry from participation in this activity. Being fully informed as to these risks and in consideration of being allowed to participate in these **City of Pasco** sponsored activities, I hereby assume all risk of injury, damage and harm to myself or my group arising from such activities. I also hereby individually and on behalf of my heirs, executors and assignees, release and hold harmless the City of Pasco, its officials, employees, volunteers and agents and waive any right of recovery that I might bring or claim of lawsuit against City of Pasco for any personal injury, death, damage to property or other consequences occurring out of my voluntary participation in this activity. I also agree to defend, indemnify and hold the City of Pasco, its officials, employees, volunteers and sponsors harmless from any and all claims, injuries, damages, losses or suits including attorney fees, arising out of or in connection with my participation in the Grand Old 4th of July Parade, or any other activities associated with the 4th of July celebration.

I and my group agree to abide by all rules and regulations previously stated in the Grand Old 4th of July Parade entry form.

I understand that all equestrian entrants must possess current and valid liability and/or home owner's insurance sufficient to cover my or my group's participation in the Grand Old 4th of July Parade.

I certify that I and/or the group I represent have current and valid driver's licenses to operate any vehicle that I/we are entering into the Grand Old 4th of July Parade. I further certify that I, or my group have Automobile Liability insurance, this includes Blanket Insurance Policies Covering the Group, which is valid and in force, covering any and all motorized vehicles that I/we will be entering in the Grand Old 4th of July Parade. Blanket Insurance Policy holders: individuals within the group do not need to show proof of insurance as long as they are covered under the Blanket Policy, and we do not need their individual signature, only the group representative needs to sign the waiver.

I hereby consent to allow my picture or likeness to appear in any official document, City of Pasco website, sponsor advertisement and/or City of Pasco produced television coverage of this sponsored activity without compensation to me.

Judging

Please note that if you are going to be judged, you will need to be ready by 8:30 am. We will do our best to judge your group or entry by the times listed: Specialty 8:30 to 9:00 am and Floats 9:00 to 9:30 am. Plaques will be awarded for the following categories: Sweepstakes and Mayors Choice. Ribbons will be awarded for the following categories: Floats: Commercial, Civic and Novelty and Specialty: Equestrian, Drill Team, Bands/Musical, and Car Club. Awards will not be given for the "Miscellaneous" category. If you are a Drill Team, Band or Musical Group you are asked to perform one quick routine of your choice. This will help our judges to better judge your group. If you need additional space to perform, please move towards the center of the road or staging area.

Floats are judged on the following:

- *Originality: This category judges the overall creativity and originality in the float design and concept.
- *Craftsmanship/Details: This category judges the quality and complexity of the float's workmanship.
- *Entertainment Value: This category judges the float's "wow factor." Judges will consider the elements such as color, sound and motion. Costumes of participants riding, walking or dancing with a float will also be considered.

Cheer/Dance/Drill Teams are judged based on the following:

- *Routine: In order to help us judge you, please plan to perform a short (1 minute or less) routine.
- *Flow of Routine: Routine moves smoothly from one segment to the next.
- *Transitions/Formations/Spacing: Routine progresses uniformly from one segment to the next.
- *Overall Appeal: Impression that the judge is left with after the routine is completed. Judges must consider all skills performed, the execution and how they are presented.
- *Expression/Enthusiasm: Smiles, spirit, naturalness and showmanship maintained throughout the entire routine.

Equestrian Entrants are judged based on the following:

- *Tack/Harness & Wagon: Must be clean and in good repair. Signage does it say who the rider(s) is, or where unit is from?
- *Riders: Apparel-must match and be suitable for parade (long sleeved shirt, pants and boots!). Colors must look good on rider(s) and horse(s). Posture-sitting up (do the riders look like they're proud and excited to be at this event?). Attentive with the public / a positive role model. Should be compatible with horse size. In control of horse or team (if wagon).
- *Horses: Must be clean, well-groomed and properly trimmed or shod. Nose and eyes clean. Hooves clean (can be painted, clear or black). Tack appropriate for horse, matches rider and/or rest of unit, and clean (outlined above).
- *Group: Creativity is good; if themed, all members of the group should conform to the overall theme. Formation lines (unit/group) should be straight from front to back and side to side; they should be lined up nicely for judging, and together as a unit.
- *Overall: Are the rider & horse, or unit noticeable (stand out) from the others, friendly, interactive, attentive?


